Open Borrowing

The Metuchen Public Library is a member of **Open Borrowing**:

A reciprocal program for library patrons to borrow in-person from among more than 150 public libraries in Northern NJ:

- LMxAC (Libraries Of Middlesex Automation Consortium),
- M.A.I.N. (Morris Automated Information Network),
- PALS (Passaic Library System),
- SWELL (Sussex Warren Electronic Lending Libraries).

What do I need to do to begin taking advantage of this membership?

Ask Metuchen Library staff to set up this service.. Staff will place a green "Open Borrowing" sticker on your library card. You can now bring your card to any Open Borrowing library so that each library may register your card in their computer system. Some locations also may require that you present a form of ID with your home address.

Visit any Open Borrowing library in person to check out their material and also return material borrowed.
